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Funding Focus – The new register of apprenticeship training providers (RoATP)

10 November 2016

Funding Focus provides quick summaries of recent funding developments, or particular aspects of the funding system.

Introduction

In October the DfE confirmed the new arrangements for the register of apprenticeship training providers, published further guidance on working with the SFA as an apprenticeship training provider, and updated the apprenticeship employer-provider guide which explains what employers need to do to become an apprenticeship training provider.

This summary is an update to the Funding Focus published on 18 August which looked at the provisional guidance the DfE released on 12 August. It:

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Section 1 The new register of apprenticeship training providers (RoATP)

From 1 May 2017, only providers and employers on the new register of apprenticeship training providers will be able to offer apprenticeship training to either levy paying or non-levy paying employers. Levy paying employers will choose providers from this new register.

The details of the new register were first proposed in August 2016 and following feedback the SFA have made changes to the original proposals. For example, sub-contracting will still be allowed under the new system, and main providers will not have to deliver the majority of an apprenticeship programme (though they do have to be involved in some part of the apprenticeship delivery).

Who needs to be on the new register (providers and employers) and eligibility rules

- Any organisation wanting a role in delivering apprenticeships for starts from May 2017 will need to successfully apply to the register.
- There is no automatic transfer to the register of apprenticeship training providers from the register of training organisations. The register of training organisations will continue for adult education budget provision, traineeships and advanced learner loans.
- Providers who want to deliver less than £100k of apprenticeship training per year as a subcontractor will not need to apply. These providers can apply if they want to have the flexibility to provide larger volumes of training or to give assurance to those they contract with that they have met the requirements of the register.
- Levy paying employers will have a digital account, and can apply to the register if they want to deliver training to their own (or staff in a connected company), to other employers' staff, or sub-contract to a main provider.
- Employers who have apprenticeships and deliver on-the-job training, but who do not wish to deliver any other training for the apprenticeship, do not need to be on the register.
- During the first year the SFA will continue to accept parent company guarantees for applications.
- Providers who have a 4 'inadequate rating for their apprenticeship provision are ineligible to apply, but organisations with a grade 4 overall but a higher grade for apprenticeship provision are eligible.

The future of sub-contracting

- In the August proposals the SFA outlined their intention to put in place tighter controls on the use of subcontracting. The SFA will continue to monitor subcontracting practices and consider making further changes if there continues to be concerns about the quality and levels of subcontracting.
- In the meantime, for a transitional period, and at the employer's request and subject to the employer's agreement, main providers will be able to bring in subcontractors.

Three application routes and tests

- **Main route:** for providers to be eligible for selection by employers to deliver apprenticeship training and lead the programme, or by another main provider to work as a subcontractor. They will need to directly provide training for each employer's apprenticeship programme they deliver (but do not have to deliver a significant majority (as originally proposed)).
- **Supporting route:** for providers to be eligible to deliver a specialism, and who only want to deliver as a subcontractor. Providers on this route will be able to deliver up to £500,000 of training per year.



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- **Employer-provider route:** for employers to be eligible to deliver training to their own staff. They will be able to lead their own programme, or act as a subcontractor to their appointed main provider.

Applicants will need to pass a range of tests in the areas of financial health, due diligence, quality, capacity and capability, differentiated according to the application route.

Applying to the register

- The new register will open for applications on 25 October 2016 and the first selection of assured providers will be drawn from those who complete their applications by 5.00pm on 25 November 2016.
- The new register will open four times a year for new applications and the SFA plan to reopen the register for applications as soon as the results from the first round are available.
- Each provider would need to reapply every 12 months if they want to maintain their registration but the SFA only require applicants to update their responses where things have changed – not to complete a new application.
- The first selection of assured providers will be drawn from those who complete their applications by 5.00pm on 25 November 2016.

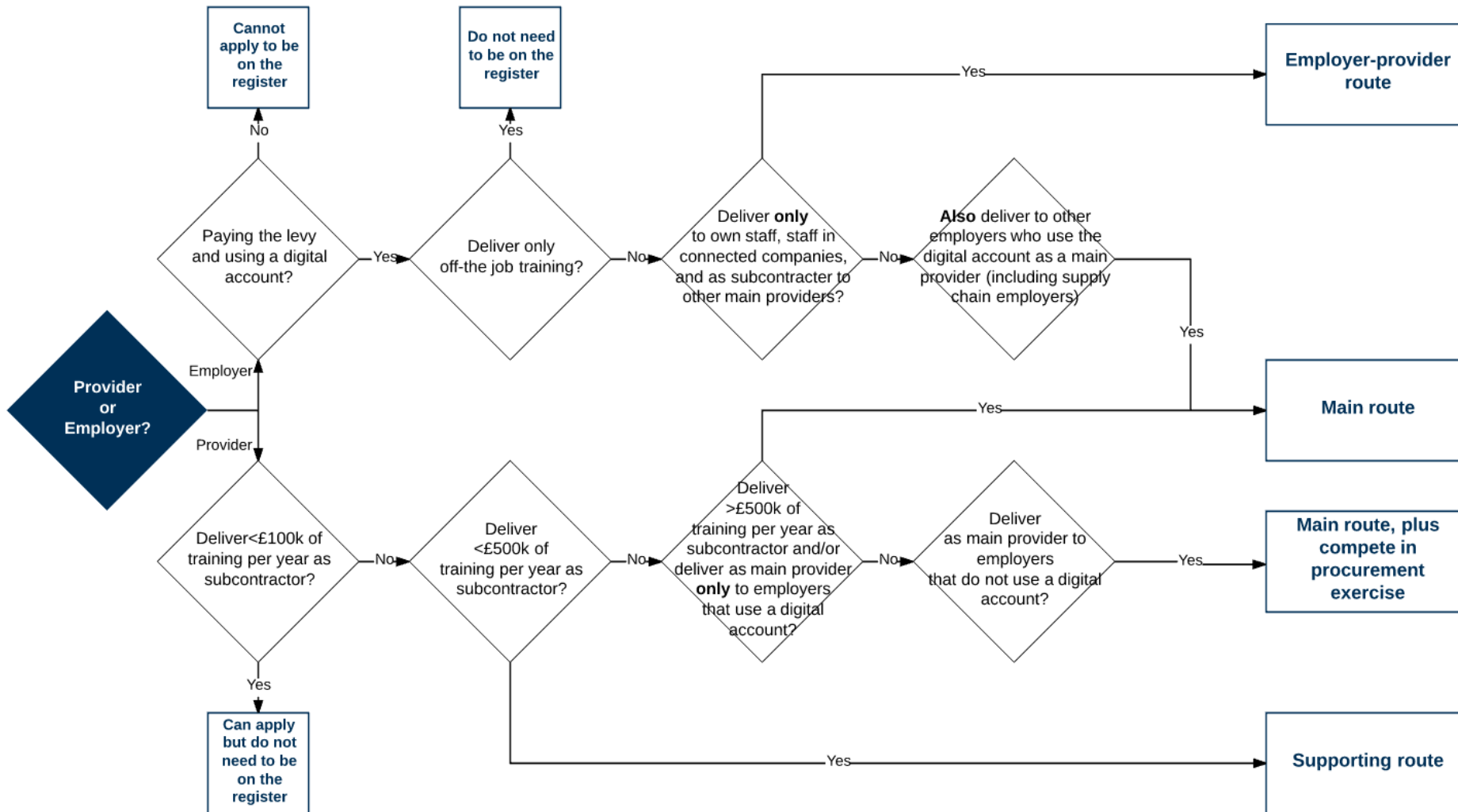
Procurement exercise for providers delivering to non-levy paying employers

- Organisations wanting to work with employers who will not be paying the levy must, as well as being on the register, respond to a separate invitation to tender and submit a successful bid. The SFA launched the procurement exercise on the same day they opened the new register (25 October).
- Applicants for the procurement will need to apply to the main route on the register and need to submit a bid. If successful in the procurement, will be awarded a contract.
- Both the register application and invitation to tender must be submitted by 5pm on 25 November 2016. For those successful in the procurement, contracts will begin on 01 May 2017 and end on 31 July 2018.
