1 Introduction

1.1 GCSE reforms

Ofqual has confirmed that all GCSEs will be linear for first teaching from September 2012 (for two-year courses).

1.2 What's the proposed timescale for these changes?

- For all two-year GCSE courses starting in **September 2012**, candidates will be applying for their GCSE award in 2014 and will be required to sit all their examinations at the end of the course.
- Candidates who started three-year courses in September 2011 will be expecting to apply for their GCSE award in summer 2014 and, therefore, will need to enter for all units in May/June 2014.

For all candidates completing GCSEs in English Literature, Geography, History and Religious Studies external assessments taken from January 2013 will include additional marks for Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (SPaG).

2 Key dates

GCSE, International GCSE and Edexcel Certificate examinations are normally held in the May-June examination series with limited subject availability in the November and January series.

2.1 Entry deadlines and results

Please see the Key Dates section of this manual for entry and results dates, and the certification and centre mark submission dates. The Key Dates section also includes details of when EDI basedata and Edexcel Online is available for the submission of entries.

2.2 Retention of certificates

It is no longer necessary to return uncollected certificates to us. They may be destroyed (in a confidential manner) after retention for a period of no less than 12 months from the date of issue.

3 Entry procedures

Centres do not need to re-enter a candidate who has a controlled assessment result as the result will be carried forward automatically for all candidates cashing in. If candidates wish to retake the controlled assessment unit the latest result will contribute to the final cash in.

Centres are not required to indicate the tier of entry as units for both tiers will be sent to them and centres may decide on the day of the examination which tier is appropriate for each candidate.
