What do you like about teaching T Levels?

The topics taught through the qualification give a broad exposure to the industry, which has the potential to lead to many different career pathways. This, combined with the actual placement within the industry, gives my students a real advantage.

Do you think employers will value T Levels?

Yes. I think that once more and more employers realise that this qualification has been written with guidance from industry leaders and professionals, and they see the theory and high-standard practical work that students are required to complete, combined with the Industry Placement, it's hard to see how they couldn't.

What elements of a T Level do learners find engaging and motivating?

How can you tell? The first year of the course is a busy one, with 14 different topics to get through, it certainly is intense. However, the variety of lessons that this requires us to deliver, means that the classroom is always exciting and new, and means the learners are always engaged. You can tell this by the number of hands going up when we have class discussions around the topics. Everyone wants to get involved and share their opinions.

Would you recommend T Levels to another Centre or teacher, and why?

I would. Many providers have not yet begun their journey with T-Levels, but I like to think of myself now as an ambassador for them, and I'm always happy to help new providers with any worries or concerns they might have about delivering them (I remember when we were in that position too, and now I think, "what were we worried about").
