From the nominator

They should tell us about their qualifications and skills, any relevant clubs or societies they belong to and any work or volunteering experience they have undertaken alongside their BTEC. Finally, they should include any other relevant details of their achievements, relative awards and responsibilities in and outside school or college.

Please provide specific examples that show its dedication and commitment to the delivery and promotion of BTECs, its excellent wider relationships with employers, colleges and universities and why you believe it is an excellent place to work and learn.

This is your chance to impress our expert judges, so please ensure you take time to think about the key things that you feel make you stand out.

You will need to complete the form found in your email and follow the instructions to submit your video.

2) Or, a 1500 written statement which expands on the information submitted at stage one by providing evidence and specific examples of the exceptional work being done by you and your team.
