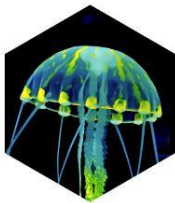

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Entry Level Certificate

The Entry Level Certificate is primarily targeted at 14- to 16-year-old students working at a level below that required for a grade 1 at GCSE.

It is designed as a one- or two-year course for learners at Entry Levels 1 to 3, either as a route towards GCSE or for learners who are unable to attain a GCSE at Foundation tier.

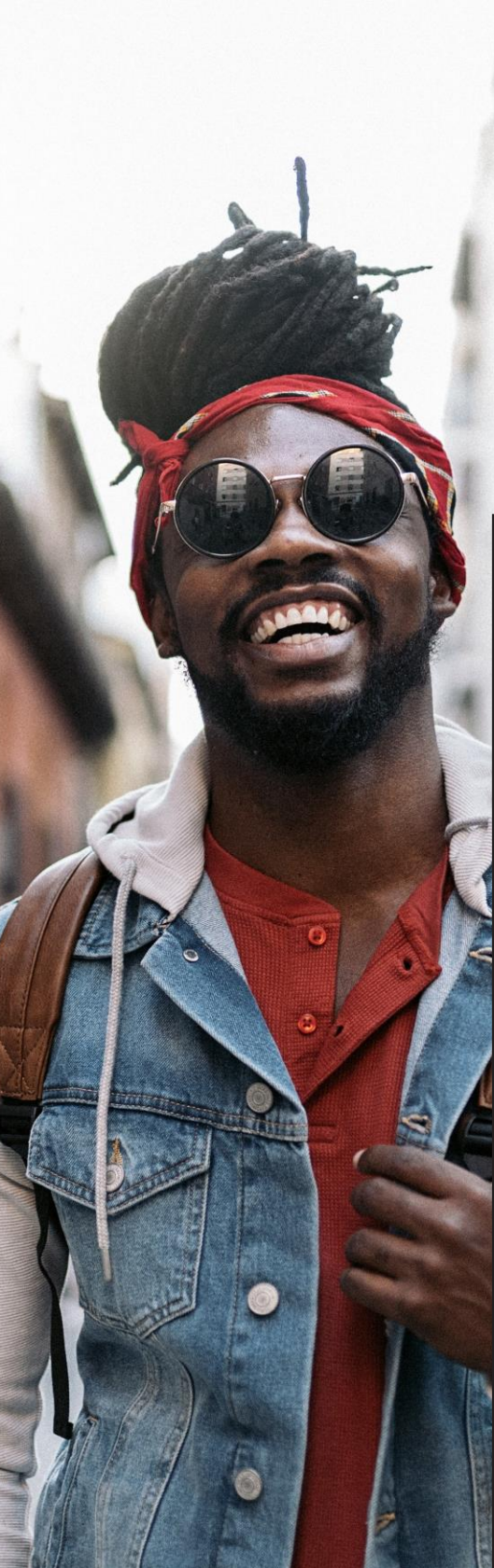

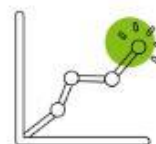
What are Pearson Edexcel Functional Skills qualifications?

Functional Skills qualifications provide reliable evidence of a learner's achievements against demanding content that is relevant to the workplace. The qualifications assess learners' underpinning subject knowledge and their ability to apply this knowledge to different contexts. They provide a foundation for progression to employment and further technical education, and they help learners to develop skills for everyday life.

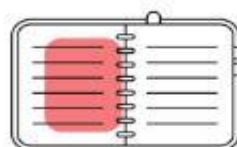
In some contexts, Functional Skills qualifications will also play a part in the government's accountability systems. Functional Skills qualifications are based on Department for Education (DfE) approved subject content and are regulated by Ofqual. Learners will work towards their qualification in several settings, including but not limited to:

- schools and sixth-form colleges
- Pupil Referral Units
- further education providers
- private colleges
- private skills providers
- offender learning establishments
- higher education establishments

Functional Skills Qualifications in English

What are Functional Skills in English?

The Pearson Edexcel Functional Skills Qualifications in English at Entry Levels 1, 2 and 3 are for learners to develop understanding and skills in English. The qualifications give learners the opportunity to:

- Demonstrate the ability at an appropriate level to read, write, speak, listen and communicate in English
- Apply this knowledge and these skills in familiar situations.
- Achieve a foundation for further study at Levels 1 and 2.

Functional Skills qualifications in English should fulfil the following purposes:

The qualifications give learners the opportunity to:

- Listen, understand and respond to verbal communication in a range of familiar contexts
- Acquire an understanding of everyday words and their uses and effects, and apply this understanding in different contexts
- Read with accuracy straightforward texts encountered in everyday life and work, and develop confidence to read more widely
- Write straightforward texts and documents with clarity and effectiveness, and demonstrate a sound grasp of spelling, punctuation and grammar.

What is the subject content for Functional Skills qualifications in English?

The subject content for Functional Skills qualifications in English has been created by the Department for Education at Entry Level 1-3. This sets out the learning outcomes and content coverage for the qualifications.

Who are the qualifications for?

Functional Skills Qualifications in English will be funded for 16–19-year-olds as part of their study programmes and adults as part of AEB funding. But is also approved for Pre-16, 16–18 and 19+.

How will these qualifications be assessed?

All levels will have an internally set and assessed Speaking, Listening and Communicating assessments. As well as an externally set, on-demand Reading and Writing assessments, internally marked and externally verified.

The assessments are pass / fail in line with the other Functional Skills qualifications.

What Levels are available?

Functional Skills in English is available at Entry Level 1-3 only as specified by the Department for Education. .

Functional Skills Qualifications in Mathematics

What are Functional Skills in Mathematics?

The Pearson Edexcel Functional Skills Qualifications in Mathematics at Entry Levels 1-3 is for learners to develop understanding and skills in mathematics. The qualifications give learners the opportunity to:

- demonstrate a sound grasp of the underpinning skills and basics of mathematical problem-solving skills appropriate to the level, and the ability to apply mathematical thinking to solve problems in familiar situations
- achieve the skills for further study at Levels 1 and 2
- achieve a foundation for progression into employment.

Functional Skills qualifications in Mathematics should fulfil the following purposes:

- Enable learners to become confident in their use of fundamental mathematical knowledge and skills
- Indicate that learners can demonstrate their understanding by applying their knowledge and skills to solve simple mathematical problems or to carry out simple tasks

The subject content for Functional Skills qualifications in Mathematics has been created by the Department for Education at Entry Level 1-3. This sets out the learning outcomes and content coverage for the qualifications.

Who are the qualifications for?

Functional Skills Qualifications in Mathematics will be funded for 16–19-year-olds as part of their study programmes and adults as part of AEB funding. But is also approved for Pre-16, 16–18 and 19+.

How will these qualifications be assessed?

All levels will have an externally set, on-demand assessment, internally marked and externally verified. The assessments are pass / fail in line with the other Functional Skills qualifications

What Levels are available?

Functional Skills in Mathematics is available at Entry Level 1-3 only as specified by the Department for Education.

Functional Skills Qualifications in Digital

Pearson Digital Functional Skills qualifications arrived in October 2023 and are available in England only at Entry Level 3 and Level 1.

What are Digital Functional Skills?

Digital Functional Skills are two new qualifications aimed at demonstrating a learner's digital skills at Entry 3 and Level 1

Digital Functional Skills qualifications should fulfil the following purposes:

- Provide reliable evidence of a learner's achievements against content that is relevant to the workplace and real life.
- Provide assessment of a learner's knowledge and skills as well as their ability to apply these in different contexts.
- Provide a foundation for progression into employment or further education and develop skills for everyday life.

What is the subject content for Digital Functional Skills qualifications

The subject content for Digital Functional Skills qualifications has been created by the Department for Education at Entry Level 3 and Level 1. This sets out the learning outcomes and content coverage for the qualifications.

Who are the qualifications for?

Digital Functional Skills Qualifications will be funded for 16–19-year-olds as part of their study programmes and adults as part of AEB funding.

How will these qualifications be assessed?

Both levels will have an externally set and marked onscreen / online assessment which will be available on demand. The assessments will be pass / fail in line with the other Functional Skills qualifications.

When will they go live?

These qualifications are live for registration and delivery as of October 2023. Assessments will be available too.

Functional Skills ICT qualifications closed for new registrations at the 31st August 2023. There will be one year of dual running to allow for learners to complete their Functional Skills ICT qualifications.

What Levels are available?

Digital Functional Skills is available at Entry Level and Level 1 only as specified by the Department for Education.
