### Can you share success stories or significant achievements during your course or your current role?

During university I ran my own esports team where I was responsible for all company admin, finances and branding, as well as content creation and keeping social channels innovative and competitive. It gave me the opportunity to lead on business strategy, work with investors and manage consultants, coaches and players.

Since joining Williams I've delivered over 250 live broadcasts, and I smashed every metric in my first week with the Virtual Imola Charity GP featuring Alex Albon.

I've managed the production of multiple inperson events, live-directing crews of 15+ people, operated the main camera for the Carlos Sainz announcement in 2024 and been entrusted with public-facing competitions in the Williams Fan Zones.

Beyond production I have helped design the look of the channel and played a key role in shaping our brand identity, assisting in the rebrand from Esports to Sim Racing. I have tripled the Williams Twitch following and have seen more growth across all accounts than any other sim racing team in 2024. I continue to enjoy managing all sim racing broadcasts.









### What aspects of your current role do you enjoy the most?

## What advice would you give to someone considering a degree in esports?
