

## Certificate to Work - FAQs

### Overview

1. Do you envisage the Certificate to Work becoming mandatory for all LGV drivers?  
We do not envisage the Certificate to Work becoming mandatory for all LGV Drivers. The Certificate to Work's purpose is to help standardise training within the sector so employers who are recruiting can be confident that new drivers will have the competence, skills and knowledge to be a safe and eco-practical driver.
2. Has the Certificate to Work been piloted by any employers?  
The Certificate to Work is in the process of being piloted.

### The Certificate to Work Programme

3. What will be the average length of the Certificate to Work programme?  
The Certificate to Work is a flexible programme aimed at a variety of different learners with different experience. Therefore some learners will need to complete all the components, where others may only have to complete a few. The length of the programme will depend on where the learner is on this journey.

We have worked with the sector to develop the CtW which aims to meet the needs of LGV drivers. We intend to review the content over time and will add additional units or content where appropriate. Individual employers may add content to support their workforce which may be accredited separately or included within the Certificate at a later date.

## Progression Opportunities and Other Sector Needs

7. The sector needs to encourage 14-16 year olds to look at the logistics sector in the future. Could the Certificate to Work model be used?

The Certificate to Work is aimed at those who specifically are going into employment. We may look at developing a vocational qualification targeting the 14-16 age group based on the overall logistics sector which could be delivered in schools and colleges.

8. Is there a progression pathway to higher levels and open up a career path past driving?

It is envisaged that learners who achieved the Certificate to Work in LGV driving will then go onto the full Level 2 Apprenticeship in Driving Goods Vehicles. We will continue to work with the sector to see if we can develop anything to help drivers with their future careers.
