## Why Work Abroad?

In the summer, most work is available in the holiday park industry, making sure the holidaymakers who stay in the tents, caravans and lodges have a great time. People without qualifications can work as cleaners, kitchen porters and promoters who hand out flyers.



**Apply for a European Health Insurance Card**

Apply for or renew your European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) if you're from the UK, European Economic Area (EEA) or Switzerland.

An EHIC lets you get state healthcare in other EEA countries and Switzerland at a reduced cost or sometimes for free.

Click [here](#) to apply online on the NHS Choices service.

EHIC is free. Some companies charge a fee to help you apply. This fee is unnecessary and you don't need to use these companies.

Everyone will need to provide the following:

- full name
- address
- date of birth
- National Insurance or NHS number (England and Wales)
- Community Health Index number (Scotland)
- Health and Care number (Northern Ireland).

EHIC doesn't replace travel insurance.

You'll have to apply by post and show proof of residency if you're not from the UK, EEA or Switzerland.

If you're from the UK, EEA or Switzerland you can apply by post or by phoning an automated service.
