

## Universal Credit

Universal credit is a new benefit to be introduced from late 2013. It will gradually replace many other welfare benefits - including housing benefit, income support and jobseeker's allowance. This curriculum model has been designed for learners preparing for the change to universal credit. This model can be as large or small as required, by choosing larger credit packages and delivering additional units/qualifications as required.

### What learners are registered on

7-12 credits (£45) plus SelfSmart diagnostic tool (£10) = £55  
Credits can be topped up at any time.
