# FIRE SAFETY

### Do you know what to do if there is a fire?

If there is a fire, the fire alarm will sound all the time. Even if you think it is only a fire drill, you must do these things:

- Stop whatever you are doing.
- Turn off machines for safety reasons but do **not** turn off computers as this takes too much time.
- Do **not** stop to collect your things.
- Close any open windows.
- If you are the last person leaving the room, close the door firmly.
- Make your way down the stairs, following exit signs unless a fire marshal sends you a different way. Do not try to use the lifts. Do not run, but walk quickly.
- Make your way to the assembly point on Mill Street. Give your name to the fire marshal on duty as soon as possible.
- Only go back into the building when told that it is safe.
