Real-life learning

The structure of BTEC qualifications is designed to adapt to the needs of students and to meet the requirements of employers.

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Our BTECs have four key features, created to make them easy to deliver.



Each qualification is made up of core units, which provide a broad introduction to the sector, and help students gain the essential knowledge of the subject area, and specialist units, which build expertise in specific areas relevant to students' needs.


This course structure means that every BTEC student gains both a deep understanding of specialist sector knowledge and the freedom to tailor their studies around their areas of interest.

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Giving students options

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For a flexible future

BTEC Level 1

Suitable for students aged 14+ who are interested in a work related course, BTEC Level 1 qualifications are designed to provide a broad introduction to a vocational sector. They provide excellent preparation for BTEC Level 2 and form a solid foundation for further vocational and academic study. SONY

BTEC Level 2

These qualifications are designed for 14 – 16 year olds who wish to explore a work-related vocational qualification or specific industry area. They can be offered alongside national qualifications or academic programmes to offer students a blended learning solution tailored to their needs and aspirations.

BTEC students can go on to further study at Level 3, such as BTEC Level 3 qualifications, Edexcel GCE A levels and International Advanced Levels. Alternatively they can continue with their main national study programme.

Provide a wider choice of sectors and course sizes

We are now offering six new sectors to our international centres and learners, for first teaching from October 2015 in sectors including; Performing Arts, Health & Social Care, Beauty Therapy, Construction and the Built Environment, Creative Media Production and Travel & Tourism.

BTEC Level 3

Aimed at students aged 16 – 18 years old, BTEC Level 3 are specialist qualifications that give students the knowledge, understanding and skills that they need to enter higher education or employment. They are ideal for those who have a clear view of their future career.

Valued by employers around the world, BTEC Level 3 programmes enable seamless progression into employment, usually as part of a career development programme (i.e. apprenticeship).

Continue to deliver our BTEC Level 3 National (2010) qualifications

We regularly review all our qualifications to ensure they continue to meet the needs of learners in helping them progress to the next stage of their lives, whether into further education or employment. In 2014, we began a review of our BTEC Level 3 National (2010) qualifications, in light of new UK government recommendations for vocational qualifications.

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As a result of our consultation with educators and key stakeholders, we are pleased to announce an extension to the last registration date for our existing BTEC Level 3 Nationals (2010) qualifications to 31 December 2017, allowing student registrations until the end of December 2017 with a last certification date of 31 December 2020. This means that you can continue to register learners onto these qualifications with confidence up until 31 December 2017. BTEC Level 3 Nationals (2010) will also continue to attract UCAS points and provide a clear progression pathway to Higher Education.
