Contact Time and Required Delivery Days

Contact time is defined as time where the learner is in the same room as the tutor and receiving training or undertaking assessment. This time DOES NOT include;

- Breaks in the delivery of the course
- Checking ID.

The table below details the minimum number of days over which the learning for the qualifications must be delivered.

Each day should not exceed **eight hours** of learning. For the delivery of the Level 2 Award for Working as a Door Supervisor within the Private Security Industry the SIA recognises that one day may be eight and a half hours to accommodate the assessment arrangements.

The SIA also recognises that the delivery of the Close Protection qualification may include exercises that will exceed eight hour days. To reflect this practice there is no restriction on the length of a training day, although all Close Protection courses should be delivered over a minimum of twelve days.
