Please note all adaptations apply to assessments completed by 31 July 2021.



Social Distance and Safety

The delivery of teaching and learning of Applied Law will not be affected by COVID-19 in the main, however social distance and safety considerations will impact the ability of centres to engage learners in practical activities such as court visits, and ability to engage professionals in classroom discussion. This could be mitigated, however, through the use of online resources and video conferencing.

Lost time teaching

As a highly content driven subject, lost teaching time may continue to impact on learning. The use of blended learning, online teaching and face to face teaching would mitigate this, however this would be reliant on provision of suitable access for all learners in order to prevent disadvantage. In terms of skill development, there will be crossover of all units as the skillset is applied to a variety of contexts.

Flexibility of delivery and assessment

Content and topics should continue to be taught as found in the specification. Centres may wish to revisit schemes of work in light of any adapted timetabling to ensure that the learning of key concepts are supported through face to face teaching wherever possible. The scheduling of unit delivery can be reviewed as necessary in the Assessment Plan for the programme. This is a working document that can flex to reflect the opportunities available and any challenges that may be present within the centre.
